## ARCHITECTURAL CABINETS AND DESIGN

### MEASURING YOUR KITCHEN

**What you will need:** Tape measure, pencil, and grid paper or plain paper.

**Getting Started:** Start at the sink wall and work your way clockwise around the room. Measure the wall (in inches) from the corner of the wall to the edge of the window trim. Note any placement of heating ducts or offsets.

**Windows and Doors:** Measure the width from outside trim to outside trim. For windows, also measure the height off the floor and the height of the window itself, including any trim or sill.

**Ceiling Height:** Measure from the floor to the ceiling in 3 locations in the kitchen. The number will most likely vary.

**Misc:** Your drawing does not have to be to scale, but if you are using grid paper it may be easier to draw the proper proportions. For  $\frac{1}{2}$ " scale, each small square = 3" and each large square = 12". For extra large spaces use  $\frac{1}{4}$ " scale, each small square = 6" and each large square = 24"
